Elements of Art: Shape


The elements of art are the basis from which artists create their artwork. Shape is defined as a two-dimensional area with a recognizable boundary. Shapes can be seen in more than one way:

- A figure is a shape that appears to be on top of the background shapes; it stands out.
- A ground is a shape that seems to be underneath or surrounding a figure.
- An organic shape is found in nature. They tend to be irregular and sometimes their edges and surfaces are relatively straight or flat, but are never perfect. Sometimes they are curved, but never perfectly round like a circle or sphere.
- A geometric shape is found in things made by people, such as buildings and bridges. Their edges and surfaces are straight or perfectly curved.

Depending on the pattern, the figure and ground can be seen as two patterns. You can reverse the figure and the ground.




